SPRING & FALL 2020 STATEMENT

The COVID-19 pandemic required significant academic changes. Unusual enrollment patterns and grading reflect the disruption of the time, not necessarily the student's work.

The university's pass/fail policy was temporarily modified. Two additional grades were used:

At the undergraduate level, a P[^] indicates an original earned grade of C- or higher.

At the graduate level, a P[^] indicates an original earned grade of C or higher.

GPA CALCULATIONS

Current system truncates GPA at 2 decimal places. Previous calculation method rounded up. All honors and Dean's List recipients prior to Fall 2001 may no longer appear eligible due to change in the system. However, they were legitimately granted at the time.

TRANSCRIPT TOTALS

Earned Hours: Number of credits earned. (grades A through D-, P, TR, TR-, E)

GPA Hrs: Credit hours used in grade point average calculation

Points: Quality points

GPA: Grade Point Average, quality points divided by GPA hours

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT COURSE REPEATS

From 1962 to 1967, courses in which a grade of "F" is received could be repeated and the cumulative grade point average recalculated without the initial failure. From Fall 1962 to Spring 1964, courses in which a grade of "D" or lower are received also could be repeated in this manner. From 1967 to Spring 1994, all repeated courses will be used in calculating the grade point average. From Fall 1994 to Summer 2003 all courses in which a grade of "C-" or lower is received may be repeated, and the most recent course and credits will be used in calculating the GPA. Effective Fall 2003, all courses can be repeated. The total number of credits that may be repeated is limited to 17, and the most recent course and credits will be used in calculating the GPA. Repeat indicators appear under "R" header. Effective Fall 2023, the highest grade is used in calculating the GPA.

GRADUATE STUDENT COURSE REPEATS

Effective Summer 2009, if a graduate student retakes a graduate course in which the student earned less than a C, both grades will appear on the student's transcript. However, only the most recent course grade and credit will be applied to the GPA and course requirements. No course may be repeated more than once without permission from the graduate advisor and Graduate Studies. Certain graduate programs may not be eligible for the retake policy.

FRESH START

Granted only once, this option removes all grades prior to "Fresh Start" from the calculation of the grade point average. The student's prior courses will be treated like those of a transfer student.

UNDERGRADUATE DEAN'S LIST & PRESIDENT'S LIST

Effective Fall 2024, matriculated undergraduate students who have earned a minimum of 9 credits on their undergraduate transcript for a semester with a 3.50 semester GPA and have no incompletes listed on their record are eligible for Dean's List recognition. President's List recognition will be granted to students who earned a 4.00 GPA and meet the same eligibility requirements for Dean's List noted above.

UNDERGRADUATE GRADUATION HONORS

Effective Fall 2024, undergraduates must earn 45 credits in residence at Central to be eligible to graduate with honors. A Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.50 – 3.69 is required for Cum laude, 3.70 – 3.89 for Magna cum laude, and 3.90 – 4.00 for Summa cum laude. Undergraduates who have achieved a grade-point average of at least 3.50 but have not completed 45 credits in residence at Central will be granted Dean's Distinction recognition.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

Courses numbered 000-099 are remedial or non-credit, 100-299 are undergraduate lower division; 300-499 are undergraduate upper division; 500 and above are graduate level. Graduate students may receive credit for certain 400-level courses.
